- b. EFTSL value of units: All units in this course have an EFTSL value of 0.125 per 10-cp unit and an EFTSL value of 0.250 per 20-cp unit.
- c. The maximum credit that may be granted for other studies not taken with Le Cordon Bleu Australia in a cognate course is 80 cp.

### **2. Rate of progression:**

- a. The expected normal rate of progression is 80 cp (or 1.0 EFTSL) per calendar year for a full-time study load.
- b. Students may not take more than 40 cp per trimester.
- c. Students may take a maximum of 12 units (120 cp) per calendar year where they have not failed a unit in the first two trimesters of any year of study.
- d. The maximum duration of completion of the course is fourteen (14) trimesters
- e. No unit can be taken more than once unless that unit is repeated because of failure.
- f. Once passed, a unit cannot be repeated.
- g. Units may be taken in any sequence in accordance with course progression rules and availability.
- h. Students may repeat a failed unit once without being asked to show cause as to why they should remain in the course. Students who fail a unit twice may be asked to show cause.
- i. Students may enrol as full- or part-time and vary this status from trimester to trimester.
- j. Students are not required to undertake consecutive trimesters whether full- or part-time, providing that they meet the minimum progression requirements for full-time, which is 80 cp per year.

### **3. Exit qualifications:**

- a. The Graduate Certificate in Hospitality Operations is an exit qualification nested in the MAHM comprising the first four (4) units of the Master of Applied Hospitality Management.
- b. The Graduate Diploma in Hospitality Operations is an exit qualification nested in the MAHM comprising the first eight (8) units of the Master of Applied Hospitality Management.

### **4. Requirements for Completion of the Degree**

To qualify for the qualification, a student must complete

160 cp from the **MAHM-MBA Schedule of Unit Offerings**, consisting of:

- (i) 90 cp of Core units
- (ii) 10 cp Capstone unit
- (iii) 40 cp Hospitality Industry Experience  
**OR**  
40 cp Hospitality Industry Research Project
- (iv) 20 cp of Open Elective units

## 5. Definitions

**Core unit:** a core unit is a required unit that must be passed in order to fulfil the requirements of the degree.

**Open Elective:** a unit requirement within a course that allows a student to select from a range of eligible units to satisfy the credit point requirement for that component of the course, provided that the student meets any applicable pre-requisites. An open elective may be fulfilled by any unit from LCBA's postgraduate curriculum that the student has not previously completed in this or any other course.

- h. Students may repeat a failed unit once without being asked to show cause as to why they should remain in the course. Students who fail a unit twice may be asked to show cause.
- i. Students may enrol as full- or part-time and vary this status from trimester to trimester.

- b. EFTSL value of units: All units in this course have an EFTSL value of 0.125 per 10-cp unit and an EFTSL value of 0.250 per 20-cp unit.
- c. The maximum credit that may be granted for other studies not taken with Le Cordon Bleu Australia in a cognate course is 80 cp.

### **2. Rate of progression:**

- a. The expected normal rate of progression is 80 cp (or 1.0 EFTSL) per calendar year for a full-time study load.
- b. Students may not take more than 40 cp per trimester.
- c. Students may take a maximum of 12 units (120 cp) per calendar year where they have not failed a unit in the first two trimesters of any year of study.

160 cp consisting of:

- (i) 90 cp of Core units
- (ii) 10 cp Capstone unit
- (iii) 60 cp from the MBA Specialisations or Open Electives in one of the following combinations:
  - a. 1 Specialisation + 2 Open Electives
  - b. 6 Open Electives

## **MASTER OF INTERNATIONAL HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT**

**Course title:** Master of International Hospitality Management

**Abbreviation:** MIHM

**Delivery:**

- d. The MIHM is delivered in Adelaide in partnership with Holmesglen Institute of TAFE.
- e. All units are delivered in trimesters in accordance with the academic calendar.
- f. Up to 5 units are delivered in online mode.
- g. All units are core, with no electives.

**Credit points:**

- a. The MIHM requires the successful completion of 160 credit points (cp) in total, where one unit of study (unit) is worth ten (10) cp, including, where appropriate, any advanced standing or credit for prior academic achievement.
- b. EFTSL value of units: All units in this course have an EFTSL value of 0.125 per 10-cp unit and an EFTSL value of 0.250 per 20-cp unit.
- c. The maximum credit that may be granted for other studies not taken with Le Cordon Bleu Australia in a cognate course is 80 cp.

**Rate of progression:**

- a. The expected normal rate of progression is 80 cp (or 1.0 EFTSL) per calendar year for a full-time study load.
- b. Students may not take more than 40 cp per trimester.
- c. Students may take a maximum of 12 units (120 cp) per calendar year where they have not failed a unit in the first two trimesters of any year of study.
- d. The expected duration for completion of the course is six (6) trimesters, or two (2) years.
- e. The maximum duration for completion of the course is fifteen (15) trimesters, or five (5) academic years.
- f. No unit can be taken more than once unless that unit is repeated because of failure.
- g. Once passed, a unit cannot be repeated.
- h. Units may be taken in any sequence in accordance with course progression rules and availability.
- i. Students may repeat a failed unit once without being asked to show cause as to why they should remain in the course. Students who fail a unit twice may be asked to show cause.
- j. Where students elect to complete a hospitality industry experience unit full-time, they may not enrol in concurrent units. Where students elect to complete a hospitality industry experience unit part-time, they may enrol in up to one (1) concurrent unit (or 10 credit points).
- k. Students may enrol as full- or part-time and vary this status from trimester to trimester.
- l. Students are not required to undertake consecutive trimesters whether full- or part-time, providing that they meet the minimum progression requirements for full-time, which is 80 cp per year.

**Exit qualifications:**

- a. The Graduate Diploma in International Hospitality Management is a qualification nested in the MIHM comprising the first eight (8) units of the Master of International Hospitality Management.
- b. Students may elect for any reason to exit the MIHM with the Graduate Diploma qualification providing that they have successfully completed all the units in the qualification.

- a. The GDIHM is a qualification nested in the MIHM comprising the first eight (8) units of the Master of International Hospitality Management.
- b. The GDIHM is delivered in Adelaide in partnership with Holmesglen Institute of TAFE.
- c. All units are delivered in trimesters in accordance with the academic calendar.
- d. Up to 2 units are delivered in online mode.
- e. All units are core, with no electives.

**Credit points:**

- a. The GDIHM requires the successful completion of 80 credit points (cp) in total, where one unit of study (unit) is worth ten (10) cp, including, where appropriate, any advanced standing or credit for prior academic achievement.
- b. EFTSL value of units: All units in this course have an EFTSL value of 0.125 per unit.
- c. The maximum credit that may be granted for other studies not taken with Le Cordon Bleu Australia in a cognate course is 80 cp.

**Rate of progression:**

- a. The expected normal rate of progression is 80 cp (or 1.0 EFTSL) per calendar year for a full-time study load.
- b. Students may not take more than 40 cp per trimester.
- c. Students may take a maximum of 12 units (120 cp) per calendar year where they have not failed a unit in the first two trimesters of any year of study.
- d. The expected duration for completion of the course is three (3) trimesters, or one (1) year.
- e. The maximum duration for completion of the course is seven (7) trimesters, or 2.3 academic years.
- f. No unit can be taken more than once unless that unit is repeated because of failure.
- g. Once passed, a unit cannot be repeated.
- h. Units may be taken in any sequence in accordance with course progression rules and availability.
- i. Students may repeat a failed unit once without being asked to show cause as to why they should remain in the course. Students who fail a unit twice may be asked to show cause.
- j. Students may enrol as full- or part-time and vary this status from trimester to trimester.
- k. Students are not required to undertake consecutive trimesters whether full- or part-time, providing that they meet the minimum progression requirements for full-time, which is 80 cp per year.

**Requirements for Completion of the Degree**

- a. Students may elect for any reason to exit the MIHM with the Graduate Diploma qualification providing that they have successfully completed all the units in the qualification.
- b. To qualify for the qualification, a student must successfully complete all units listed for the GDIHM in the **MIHM Schedule of Unit Offerings**, consisting of:
  - (i) Marketing Management;
  - (ii) Hospitality Design;
  - (iii) Service Quality Management;
  - (iv) Global Business Environment;
  - (v) Accounting for Managers;
  - (vi) People, Leadership and Performance;
  - (vii) Managing Hospitality in the International Context;

(viii) Research Methods for Decision Making.
